- ii) Application must be submitted before the above deadline.
- iii) Participants must be Early Career Researchers: PhD candidate or holding a PhD or equivalent research experience and having up to 10 years post-PhD research experience.
- iv) Participants must have a research or academic position (registered PhD student, a permanent/contract post, research contract or fellowship) at a recognised Higher Learning Institution or Research Institution either in the UK or in Malaysia.
- v) Please note that participants are expected to attend all sessions of the workshop.

Quality Assessment

- i) Experience and relevance of the applicant's research area to the workshop
- ii) Motivation and contribution to the aims of the workshop

- iii) Description of the long term impact expected through the participation in the workshop
- iv) Ability to disseminate workshop's outcomes
